- 3) Integrative Health and Wellness Center
- 4) Education Center, including K-12 Montessori and a Community Education Campus aligned to major universities
- 5) Renewable energy independence solar, wind, bio, possible geothermal
- Setting the standard for energy conservation measures in a retrofit
- 7) Water conservation, storage, and recycling techniques
- 8) Commercial and business core, including cottage industries, professional services, and a proposed casino/hotel to fund sustainability projects and education
- 9) Community Center office space, library, and meeting rooms for residents
- 10) Condos and apartments for a variety of income levels
- 11) Day-care service
- 12) On-site grocery

Providing a wide range of services and opportunities where people live allows for high degrees of energy efficiency. With everything they need close by, people living and working at Whittier Village will lower their transport expenses and will have more time to spend with family and friends, with more opportunities for cultural enrichment and life fulfillment.
